We, the Israelite Community, are deeply saddened as we recognize this moment of despair where many feel helpless and hopeless due to the battle with the COVID-19 pandemic that has taken over 100,000 lives, record unemployment of 42 million, and a country stifled by racial injustice past and present. The future of this 243- year experiment called American Democracy is at a crossroads and it has never been more uncertain.

This nation continues to fight another virus, the one it was born with. A virus for which it has found no vaccine or cure. This virus is the disease of slavery, racism, and injustice. Worse than any Coronavirus, it has caused the death of countless people in this country. The Confederacy's attack sought to destroy the bodies of blacks, leaving them crippled. The Civil war ended the fever, but recovery was gripped in pain and weakness.

The virus remained, rebounded, and mutated into Jim Crow, which caused death and destruction among the descendants of those who survived the initial outbreak. Its constantly present, wreaking havoc and destroying lives as we wait for a cure. We were given new hope that we shall overcome when we saw black and white faces, of various ethnicities, rich, poor, from both political sides have a clear message that in unity there is strength to repair the breaches of this American experiment.

The last three years of immature, narcissistic leadership of this country has dismissed the pain of the many and the reality of truth. This leadership has chosen to ignore the needs of our community. They were victims of hatred due to lies and racism passed down generations throughout America's history. Racism, bigotry and propaganda were used to justify inhumane rule and oppressive treatment of people with black and brown skin.

We stand in solidarity with community activists, whose goals are to educate the African American community to counteract the lack of self-esteem and lack of confidence brought about by 400 years of oppression and marginalization. We stand with peaceful protestors, and any organizations; whose goals are to provide equal educational opportunities for
